

SAT Info for Seniors

Who needs the SAT? If you are planning to go directly to a four-year college after high school graduation, you will need to have a SAT or ACT score. Students planning to continue their education at a community college are not required to have a SAT or ACT score.

When is the SAT given? The SAT is given seven times each year. Please note that it is given only three times each year at Person High. Students will need to register to take the test approximately four weeks before the test date.

How do I sign up for the test? You can register by going to the website (www.collegeboard.com) and click on register for the SAT, or you can obtain a paper registration form to mail in to College Board.

How much does the SAT cost? The cost to take this test is \$ 45. There is an additional \$ 23 late fee if you register after the first deadline. We have a small number of fee waivers available to our students who meet the federal guidelines for free lunch. Some schools will waive their application fee for students who used a fee waiver on the SAT. We have these waivers as well. The ACT is given at nearby schools. SAT Info for Juniors

If you have completed Algebra II it is time to plan to take the SAT in your junior year. Every junior who is planning to attend a four year college the fall of 2010 need to take the SAT prior to their senior year. You can take the test as many times as you wish.
